Please prepare a short CV to include in your application form, following these guidelines.

The short text should introduce your professional background clearly and briefly. It helps reviewers get to know you at a glance. Please write it as a summary in paragraph form, not copied from your full CV.

STRUCTURE

1. Full name, including prefix (Prof./Dr.)
2. Up to 120 words (max.) in paragraph format, that include:
Current position/s Professional background Academic background

LANGUAGE

Please be sure to check the English and spelling before submitting.

EXAMPLES

Prof. Emily Carter

Director of the Halstead Center for Neurological Disorders at Brookmere Medical Center and senior lecturer in Clinical Neurosciences at Westbridge University. A board-certified neurologist, Emily focuses on neurogenetic disorders in both clinical care and translational research. She works with the Global Society for Advanced Cellular Therapies and co-founded ElaraTx, a clinical-stage biotech developing treatments for rare neurological conditions. She is also co-founder of Belyra Therapeutics, specializing in B cell engineering for neuro-oncology. Emily earned her MD and PhD from Westbridge University and graduated summa cum laude from its Harrington Program for Interdisciplinary Excellence.

Dr. Daniel Morgan

Head of AI and Computational Biology at Avenir Biosciences, where he leads a scientific team based in Grayford. A physician-scientist, Daniel works at the intersection of deep learning and functional genomics, developing models to advance precision medicine.
